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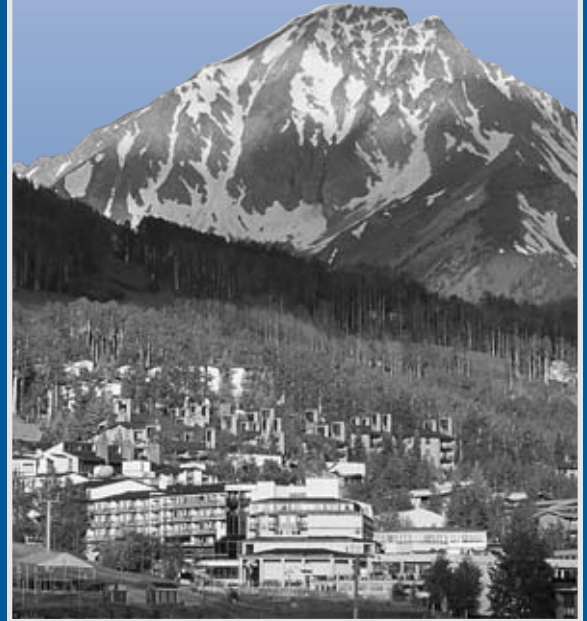

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This course is designed for physicians and other health care providers that care for patients with infections involving the musculoskeletal system.

OBJECTIVES AND OVERVIEW

This scientific meeting is designed to discuss new research in musculoskeletal infections, clinical advances, diagnostic methodologies, treatment approaches and protocols.
